- c, Ben is getting a quote from the county for Private Lands Ahead signs.

- 9, The NW corner of the Jerving Conservancy is currently being used as a canoe/ kayak launch accessing the Black River via Fisher Creek. It's steep & unsafe. Another option is by the bend of the Black River, along Lake Shore Drive. Fisherman are currently using the area. We will scout during the next meeting & determine the best location for the proposed new canoe/ kayak launch area.
- 10, Balzer wood new trail walk-through date will be set during the next meeting once the conditions have improved.
- 11, Ideas were discussed for the Anthony Van Asten volunteer service project on June 10th. Location: The Jerving Conservancy. Volunteers will be assisting with trail building, barberry & honeysuckle removal, trail signs & bench construction and installation.
